


Combine your favourite pastime with the new Granite Belt Bike Trail, a marked 34km trail along country roads. Start at the picturesque creekscape in Queensland's high altitude, cool climate town of Stanthorpe and meander your way through quaint country villages towards Ballandean, Queensland's most rewarded wine region.

Work up an appetite as you pedal to award winning restaurants, cafes and wineries. Breathe in the fresh air and appreciate the country lifestyle with views of Granite outcrops nestled amongst vineyards, wildflowers and fruit blossoms.

Stop at a winery, cafe, restaurant or food producer along the way with over 20 places to choose from, most no more than a kilometre off the cycle trail.

Rest stops, signage, toilets and bike racks are provided en-route to ensure your journey is comfortable, safe and memorable.

The bike trail is shared use with motor vehicles so we do ask that you take care, be safe and be aware of your surroundings.

Eat, drink, play along the way

The Granite Belt is Queensland's premier wine region and nationally awarded for its' gourmet produce. Take a short detour off the bike trail route to enjoy the best of elevated taste.

Meed a break? Two rest areas are provided at intervals along the way, as well as a signed toilet area half way along the trail.

Teeling hungry. With over 8 cafes and restaurants along the trail, you can pause for a lunch, stop for a picnic or pick up some wine, cheese, olives or fudge along the way.

Sing a different song? Queensland's most awarded wines are at your fingertips. Drop in to meet the winemaker or try something new with the Strange Bird Alternative Wine Trail.

Mant to explore? Bike racks are provided at the Stanthorpe Visitor Information Centre and in Ballandean, so you can leave your bike safely while you explore the sites of these two towns.
